Church Family,

Our Annual Disciple Now weekend is quickly approaching! In fact it is this weekend, October 6th-8th. Our goal with Disciple now is two fold, 1) help those that have a relationship with Jesus Christ strengthen their relationship and 2) present the Gospel of Jesus to those students that do not know Jesus as Lord and Savior. This year we have Pastor Chad Poe from Grace Bible Church in Clute, TX (near Lake Jackson, TX) sharing the gospel with us, for our Friday and Saturday Sessions. On Sunday Morning, October 8th, my good friend Garrett Wagoner will be sharing the word of God with us. Garrett is the Student Evangelism Coordinator with the Southern Baptist Texas Convention. Leading us in worship for the weekend will be Kenny Klinglesmith, Kenny leads worship at Grace Bible Church in College Station, TX. We are really excited about these men joining us for the weekend and we are praying that the Lord will use them in mighty ways to advance the gospel here in Hamlin. Church family I cannot over state how important your prayers are for this weekend. We need you to commit to praying for the students. But not just that I would love to see many of you join us with your presence during this powerful weekend. Yes the weekend is geared toward the students but the gospel message they will be hearing is for you too! On Friday Night we will be hosting our first session in the south parking lot of Vista Bank. We want to get outside the walls of the youth building, and share the good news of Christ with anyone and everyone that has ears to hear. Please come and join us that evening, worship with us, sit under the preaching of God's word with us, be present in the lives of these students, and invite someone to come with you! Bring a lawn chair and experience the power and presence of the Lord at work in the lives of the young people that come. This very first session will begin at 7:15pm on Friday, October 6th. If you come early we may even feed you! Let's treat this like a revival service, not a youth event!

In the past we have canceled Sunday School during the Dnow weekend, but we will not be doing so this year. The students will be served a pancake meal in the youth building, and our normal Sunday morning activities will go uninterrupted. In other words we will still have our regular scheduled Mega Group and Sunday School time. If your Mega Group table signed up for breakfast that morning you still need to prepare breakfast for our regular mega group crowd. When the students are done eating they will be joining us for Mega Group so be prepared to have some extra bodies at your table during the teaching and discussion time.

The cost of the weekend is \$25 and all 6th-12th grade students are encouraged to join us. There are always a few students that cannot afford the cost of Dnow so if any of you feel lead to give a special donation to cover the cost of a few students we would greatly appreciate that.

This weekend is not a weekend to check out because it's a "youth weekend", in fact it is the opposite, it is a time to be more plugged in. Hope to see you there!

One other thing I'd like to challenge us with is the idea of building community and fellowship in our church body. One of the ways we'd love for you to do this is by plugging in with a Mega Group table and participating in the once a month fellowships! The first Sunday of every month, we are cancelling evening services to make sure we have time scheduled for these gatherings! If you don't have a table or a fellowship to go to, please come talk to me and I'd love to invite you and get you the details of what all is going on! Another way to build community and deepen relationships within our church is to spend time with one another. An easy way to do this is to grab someone you don't know very well and be intentional about making a plan to get together.

I'd like to challenge each of you in our church to think about a different family or individual you can invite over each month. Share a meal together, watch a game, play a game, have coffee, the sky is the limit! Just look around our Sanctuary on a Sunday morning and ask, who is it I don't know very well that I can be intentional about spending time with? It may be someone you've "kind of" known for years or it may be someone who is visiting our church for the first time. Whichever the case, lets grow our community in our church, lets strengthen our relationships with Christ and with each other, and then let us lock arms and take this great hope we have to share with those beyond our walls.
